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### **About Us**

Omega Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated (OPBSI) was founded on March 15, 1989 as a non-profit organization in the State of New York. We are a Latina-oriented sorority dedicated to serving our community and providing a rich sisterhood. Our membership comprises of women from various ancestries throughout the world including: Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as parts in Africa, Europe and Asia. Our diversity is not only limited to our ethnicity but also to the various characteristics and talents that we bring as individuals that come together as a unit to make OPBSI a successful, prosperous and advancing organization.

### Herstory

We were founded in 1989 at Albany, State University of New York by seventeen dedicated women of various cultural and ethnic backgrounds who came together to create an outlet for women to initiate change and fight against the injustices historically suffered by our gender. As the first Latina-oriented organization in the history of the University at Albany, our Founders struggled to establish our organization, our purpose and most importantly, set a precedent.

In under a year, OPBSI co-founded the Latino Greek Council (LGC) at the University at Albany. This council served as a support system for those organizations that did not share the agenda or identified themselves with the already established councils at the University at Albany. The LGC has proven its sustenance as it has served as the framework and model for other Latino Greek Councils on a National level nationwide.

With an emphasis on community service and sisterhood, OPBSI immediately became a positive influence within the community at the University at Albany, as well as in the city of Albany. Thus began our growth first at neighboring universities, and today across the nation. What brought together our seventeen founders still attracts so many women today. Although our orientation is Latina, we are open to women of all cultural backgrounds, our motto "Serving and Educating Through our Diversity" is a testament to how we embrace not only cultural or ethnic differences, but also socio-economic, ideological, and differences in identities and abilities. OPBSI thrives on the diversity of its members and we attribute a lot of our success to our organization's ability to embrace each member's differences.

As OPBSI moves towards the future we can look back with pride. Since 1989 we have served and educated a multitude of communities, donated thousands of dollars to various charities and philanthropic causes, completed thousands of hours in community service, and continued to excel in academic pursuits, inclusive of recognition at various campuses as the sorority with the highest grade point average. Along with our accomplishments within our communities we have excelled as a sisterhood by providing each other with unconditional support in professional and personal endeavors. OPBSI has been able to capture the true essence of sisterhood and we are eagerly open to extend our family to others.

OPBSI was established due to the desire of identifying with and establishing our culture as well as symbolizing order, strength and unity. Our founders set their precedent and today we stand alongside them and exemplify what our values, traditions, and customs symbolize.

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Our Programs & Initiatives



### **RAY OF HOPE WALK**

The Ray of Hope Walk to End Violence against Women (ROHW) brings to life our vision of "a world without oppression where empowered women celebrate the essence of womanhood and act as resources in the advancement of their communities." By raising awareness of Violence against Women, the ROHW helps support local and national organizations that work towards ending gender-based violence. This annual event focuses on challenging women and men alike to be a part of the movement to end this global epidemic. Our goal is to create a safe, equitable and nurturing society for women and girls. Since its inception, the ROHW has raised over \$60,000 for organizations such as the National Organization for Women (NOW), MADRE Inc., V-Day, INCITE!, PAVE (Promoting Awareness | Victim Empowerment), AF3IRM, and SisterSong Women of Color Reproductive Justice Collective.

#### REACH FOR THE GOLD SCHOLARSHIP

The Reach for the Gold Book Scholarship is awarded to a college bound high-school senior demonstrating academic excellence and a commitment to service and her community. The winner receives \$1,000 towards the cost of academic text books and materials in an effort to help her succeed her first year in college. It is administered by our Alumnae Association and available to students across the nation.

#### THE GOLDEN COLIBRI GRANT

The Golden Colibri Grant has been established to recognize and support professional and academic development among alumnae members of OPBSI. The Alumnae Association awards \$500 annually to one grant recipient towards the pursuit of an advanced degree, professional certification, specialization, or license. In order to foster mentorship and networking among alumnae members, the award recipient is expected to present her experiences and reflections to the Sorority at large in the format of her choice, within a year following receipt of grant.

### STEPPIN' OFF TO UNITE LATINAS (S.O.U.L.)

S.O.U.L. was created as an affiliate to the National Step/Stroll Team to bring together girls age 8-17 to learn about responsibility, creativity, friendship, and dedication through the fundamentals of the art of stepping. Current participants in this program include young women from the NYC Metropolitan area. One of our most important goals is to assist in teaching these young women the skills needed to succeed in all aspects of their lives.
